- NS's Deputy Minister of Education invited us to present the Catapult model to the **Transition Task Force** whose mandate was to recommend more effective ways to transition students into university or the work force.
- Lauren, Liam and Vanessa were appointed to the **Youth Advisory Committee** to NS's Minister of Education.
- Megan was awarded the \$20,000 Clifford & Helena Oliver Bursary by Acadia University. Rachel received a full scholarship from Metro Care & Share. Ali was awarded a \$5,000 Horatio Alger Scholarship. And many others earned scholarships towards their post secondary education.
- Our annual Catapult Plus \$1000 Bursary went to Brooke.
 She was on 4 sports teams, the events and social awareness committees, and organized a youth health summit.
- Haley and Desiree were awarded the Lieutenant Governor Awards for leadership and citizenship (bringing our Catapult tally to 16!). Raianne received the Queen Elizabeth II Medal!
- Megan, Kiara and Kayan were each awarded an HRM Youth Volunteer Award. Brandon was recognized as River Hebert's 'Student Volunteer of the Year".
- Vanessa, Kiara, Shea and Kristoff became their Student Council Presidents (bringing our tally up to 13!)
- Catapult's 2016 Counselor team was star studded with
 100% returnees with an average experience of 4.4 years!
- 2016 conference staff included 2 catapulter counselors and 1 catapulter admin support. And we recruited our 4 junior counselors from Catapult's class of 2014.
- Lauren was re-elected NS's rep for the National Council of Boys and Girls Club and facilitated a workshop on 'Youth Volunteerism' at their national conference!
- Sarah created a SMILE club at her school, providing fun lunch-time activity for disabled students. She is Catapult's 7th student to do so!

- 2010 Catapulter Liam shared the impact of his camp experience to a crowd of 900 business people at the **Halifax Chamber**'s annual spring dinner.
- Catapulters from various years carried our banner at Halifax's **Pride Parade**. Others united in the Walk for MS.
- Over 40 Catapulters from numerous schools re-connected at **We Day Atlantic** including our own Catapult group of 8 (thanks Advocate!).
- Robyn was awarded a full scholarship for a 3-wk Irish
 Language Immersion program in Ireland!
- Cameron created a public speaking club at Central Kings.
 He then competed at the NS Skills Competition where fellow catapulter Emily won!
- Taylor was one of 200 Canadian youth selected to attend Adventures in Citizenship in Ottawa. She was also accepted to Me to We's Leadership camp at St FX.
- Skye & Joel made top 10 in CEED's Student Superpower Challenge. Skye won \$5,000 of non-cash support to help develop her app called LOVE which connects willing volunteers to local charities.
- We began inviting a Catapult alum to our **Board meetings**.
 It's not only a great opportunity for them, but they also add energy and effective feedback to our meetings.
- Relations were strengthened and new connections made with other youth organizations including Pathways,
 MacPhee Centre, HRM Connections, Heartwood and Halifax North Youth.
- At conference, all students shared their 'pay forward
 projects' (and practiced their public speaking skills at the
 same time). Their projects were inspiring and ranged from
 volunteering at a nursing home, to organizing a dinner to
 raise money/awareness for military personnel with PTSD, to
 coaching or tutoring at junior schools. All projects were
 meaningful and all provided practical leadership lessons.

Our Signature Camp

7 days at Acadia, the focus is on accelerating leadership potential by boosting confidence and preparing them to start high school as active leaders. Students must be nominated by a Grade 9 teacher. Average age is 15.

Career Coaching

Guided by our videos and handbook, our students are matched with a mentor to help choose a career direction and plan post secondary education.


PLUS Conference
